Ilia State University (ISU) is a flagship public research and comprehensive higher education institution in Georgia that was established in 2006 as a merger of six different institutions, each having a long history and a diverse institutional profile.

With the highest competition rate for Ph.D. programs in the nation, approximately 17 000 students including around 800 international students from 61 countries, 988 highly qualified academic staff, and with renovated research infrastructure,

ISU has become one of the most desirable universities to study in the country over the last 10 years. ISU has been ranked by THE, Scimago Institutions Ranking, and others in top positions among regional and local universities.

ERASMUS + APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Application Requirements:

- Nomination from Partner University
- English language skills min. B2

Required documents:

- Europass CV
- Transcript of records
- Proof of enrollment at Home University
- Language Certificate/reference issued by the home university (language level is B2 at minimum)
- Approved Learning Agreement from both, home and host universities (for the list of courses please see Exchange courses)
- Diploma of previous academic level completed
- Copy of passport

All documents must be issued or translated into English

Recommended Language Skills:	English: min. B2 level is recommended
Academic Offer:	<p>Incoming exchange students can take a number of English-taught courses across different faculties</p> <p>All exchange students will have the possibility to learn Georgian language for 6 ECTS. The Practical Course of Georgian Language is available for Bachelor, Master and PhD students</p>
Credits and Grading System:	<p>ECTS credits: one ECTS credit equals 25 hours of work including lectures, seminars, practical work, and self-study. Most of the courses are 6 ECTS. A typical semester includes 30 ECTS credits.</p> <p>Grading system (ECTS): seven-level (A to FX) grading scale from 0 to 100 Transcript of Records will be issued within 4 weeks after the assessment period has finished. It will include information on courses taken, credits earned and final grades.</p>

VISA INFORMATION & ARRIVAL

Check whether you are required to obtain Visa or Residence permit for studying in Georgia:

- EU citizens/permanent residency holders are free to enter and stay in Georgia for up to 1 year without a visa.
- Some non-EU countries may require a visa. The fastest and easiest way to check whether you need a visa to enter and/or stay in Georgia - <https://www.geoconsul.gov.ge/en/entering-georgia>

Flights to Georgia:

Georgia has two main international airports: **Tbilisi International Airport (TBS)**, the largest and busiest, and **Kutaisi International Airport (KUT)**, serving mainly low-cost and regional flights. Both airports connect Georgia with major European and regional cities. (tbilisiairport.ge)



ACCOMMODATION & LIVING

Ilia State University does not have a student dormitory, however, visiting students and staff can receive guidance and support from IRO in finding housing options according to their preferences.

The prices for a furnished studio in a central area range from 400 to 500 EUR, while the prices for a shared apartment in a normal/peripheral area range from 200 to 400 EUR per month, depending on the number of roommates and area. Please be aware that the cost of renting depends on the location.

The local currency in Georgia is Georgian Lari (GEL)

Health Insurance:

While not mandatory for incoming students at Ilia State University, we recommend having health insurance to ensure coverage during your stay in Georgia. If interested, the International Relations Office (IRO) can provide further information and guidance.



TRANSPORTATION & Other Useful Info

Transportation card costs 40 GEL (monthly) and 250 GEL (yearly) and it covers all types of public transportation (Metro, Bus, Minibus and Cable Car.)

- METRO – One of the most popular city transports is Metro, underground transport
- MINIBUS - Also called as “marshutka”
- Buses and minibuses run at fixed times from 7am till 12pm. The public transportation has fixed routes and schedules
- TAXI - Bolt
Using a taxi is the best option for getting around Tbilisi by car. The app “Bolt” is best for taxi services.

TIPS

you must bare in mind

CHECK OUT 10 THINGS YOU MIGHT NOT KNOW ABOUT GEORGIA:

- Georgians do not call their country Georgia, it is called Sakartvelo (საქართველო) in Georgian
- While in the bus, you can enter and leave through any door, not necessarily enter from front or get off from back
- Georgians usually drink a lot, maybe better not to compete
- Georgians drive crazy; keep this in mind for your safety
- While crossing the street, look both of the sides, even though it is green light for pedestrians
- People are very helpful. If you ask for directions to a location to a random person on the street, they may not only tell you where it is but may also directly walk with you to show you
- Most food stores and shopping malls are open until 22:00 every day with no breaks. You may find many 24/7 markets and pharmacies throughout the city
- If you want to call a taxi, it is easiest and cheapest to call a taxi company. You only have to give your location and destination, and the taxi will arrive in a few minutes
- Tipping is usual in Georgia but not obligatory
- Georgia is a “close distance country”. So do not be surprised if after a few meetings someone will give you kiss and hug
